Ensure competitiveness of Florida's business climate

Implement an integrated economic stimulus strategy for areas of rural critical economic concern:

- Provision of technology
- nature & heritage-based tourism business
- small business
- historic preservation
- attraction of retirees and leveraging retiree talent in volunteer and professional service
- expansion of existing businesses
- attraction of new businesses
- creation of homegrown small businesses

Promote arts and historic preservation in rural quality of life and diversification strategies

Employ a Smart Growth strategy and integrated planning including libraries, which balances:

- quality of life
- environmental stewardship
- value-added economic growth
- flexible government

Educate Floridians on the integral link between historic preservation, cultural arts, land use and the environment, tourism and economic development.

Recognize and promote the knowledge-based, higher value-added part of Florida's economy as an emerging area of vital importance for the future.
